

# LEAVES



1. Collect ten leaves from different trees.
2. Collect ten leaves from other plants.
3. Press your leaves and identify.
4. Paint one leaf with chocolate.
5. Make two different leaf rubbings.
6. Make two pieces of stationary using a leaf design.
7. Make two stamped leaf note pages.
8. Make two book marks using leaves.
9. Discover the trees and leaves in your yard or church yard. Learn something special about each one.
10. Put your dried leaves and projects in a Leaves Scrap book.
11. Read verses in the Bible about leaves.

## HELPS:

1. & 2. Encourage variety in shape, color and size.
3. Press leaves, dry carefully, print names below each leaf.
4. Melt semi-sweet chocolate. Using a small brush, paint a leaf, (maple leaf or other leaf with deep veins works best). Set on a tray covered with wax paper, refrigerate. When chilled, help to gently remove leaf and discover leaf pattern in chocolate. Chocolate leaves may then be eaten.
5. Place leaf under white paper and gently rub a color crayon over the leaf and watch leaf appear on your paper.
6. Glue a pressed leaf on corner of paper. An envelope may have a matching leaf attached.
7. Stamp the leaves with ink and transfer to paper and envelope.
8. Place pressed leaves on bookmark sized paper, cover with contact paper and neatly trim.
9. Some plants need shade, others full sunlight, some much water, others may be drought resistant, some start with seeds, other bulbs, etc.
10. Make a neat scrapbook, identify each leaf, use plants that are common to your area.
